On the left,across: "VICTORIA, IN HER EIGHTY-FIRST / YISPARED / HERSELF NO /EXERTION OR FATIGUE / IN SPEEDING HER SOLDIERS / TO SOUTH AFRICA, /VISITIN WOUNDED, / SYMPATHISING WITH / THE BEREAVED AND / WELCOMING HOME HER / (ornament) SAILORS. / SALSO GAVE UP / HER HOLIDAY / ABROAD TO VISIT / HER BELOVED / IRISH / SUBJECTS.".

Notes: Nottingham Victoria station was officially opened on 24 May 1900. This was Queen Victoria's 81st birthday. The station on 4 September 1967 and was demolished.
