St. Helena is a small island in the South Atlantic 2000 km west of Southern Africa. After Napoléon's defeat at the Ba Waterloo, he was taken to the island in October 1815 where he resided as a captive in Longwood House until his death May 1821.

The medal was produced to commemorate the return of Napoleon's remains to France in 1840.
