On left, two kneeling maidens, holding agricultural products. Items of industry on ground about. behind with ship on right and (improbably) St. Paul's Cathedral.

Reverse: Within a reeded rim, front view of the exhibition building. Angel flying above, left, wreath in right hand, palm frond in left above: "THE INTERNATIONAL EXHIBITION OF / 1862 (across)". In the exergue: "(arrow head) OPENED 1ST. MAY 1 (arrow head) / DESIGNED BY / CAPTAIN FOWKE R.E. / ERECTED BY (in an arc) / MESSRS. KELK AND LUCAS (in Signed below the exergue line: "OTTLEY (left) BIRMM. (right)"

**Notes:** The 1862 International Exhibition was held from 1 May to 1 November, beside the gardens of the Royal Horticultural So South Kensington, London.
