Reverse: Within a four-petal shaped frame and against an ornate crossed-hatched background, an angel, front, holding a shield: "MITTAM / EX EIS / IN / AFRICAM / (cross)". Four flowers outside in the angles.

Notes: The Society of African Missions is a Roman Catholic missionary organization. The Society was founded in 1856 by Bisl Melchior de Marion Brésillac with the blessing of Pope Pius IX. It is believed that the medal was made to help raise the needed to establish the society.
