Pieter Arnoldus Cronjé (1836 – 1911) was a Z.A. Republiek general in the Anglo-Boer wars of 1880-1881 and 1899-199 was defeated at the Battle of Paardeberg where he and 4,150 commandos surrendered to Lord Roberts on 27 February He spent the remainder of the war as a POW on St. Helena.
