Notes: Sir George Grey (1812-1898) was Governor of Cape Colony between 1854 and 1861 and played a leading role in the establishment of educational institutes throughout the Colony. The Port Elizabeth municipality receive a land grant from government some of which was sold to raise capital for the building of a school. The Grey Institute high school was form opened in April 1859. The school today has over 800 boys and is now called Grey High School.

The school motto, Tria Juncta in Uno (three joined in one) is taken from the British Most Honourable Order of the Bath of Sir George Grey was created a Knight Commander in 1848.
