Notes: The new coat of arms was introduced on Freedom Day, 27 April 2000, and was designed by Mr Iaan Bekker. It replace earlier national arms, which had been in use since 1910. The motto is written in the extinct |Xam, member of the Khoisa languages, and translates literally to "diverse people unite". The previous motto, in Latin, was Ex Unitate Vires, translate "From unity, strength".
