Edge: Plain.

Obverse: Conjoined bareheaded busts, left, he in uniform. Legend on a ribbon: "THEIR R.H. THE DUKE AND DUCHESS OF CORNWALL AND YORK.". Signed: "AM" on the truncation. Stamped with the silver hallmark for Birmingham 1901 and maker's mark "AM".

Reverse: Coat of arms of the Cape Colony with antelope supporters, Hope crest and motto: "SPIES BONA". Above across: "SPE VIVIT DE TWENTY NINE". Below across: "THE DUKE AND DUCHESS OF CORNWALL AND YORK VISIT THE CAPE 1901". Below: "RIFLE(?) COMPETITION". The remainder of the inscription (presumably the name of the rifle competition) has been erased on this example.

Notes: The visit to South Africa was part of a world tour of British Colonies to show Royal appreciation for their support during the Boer War.
