Reverse: Coat of arms of Cape Colony, antelope supporters and Hope crest with motto on a ribbon below: "SPIES BONA". In an above around: ". TO COMMEMORATE THE CORONATION ." then across: "OF / HIS MAJESTY / KING EDWARD VII" below the arms in arcs: "26TH. JUNE 1902 / RONDEBOSCH".
