Form: Circular with two attached lugs for link rings presumably to a suspension bar.

Edge: Plain.

Obverse: In the centre within a circular beaded border, old-head bust of Queen Victoria, right. Around her, the busts of six generals, separated by ornamental lines between them, each named below the bust. Clockwise from the top left: "ROBERTS", "BULLER", "FRANKLIN", "GATACRE", "KITCHENER" and "WHITE".

Reverse: Within a toothed border round the rim, unofficial coat of arms of Canada used at that time representing seven provinces: Ontario, Quebec, Nova Scotia, New Brunswick, Manitoba, British Columbia and Prince Edward Island

Notes: Similar medals with different reverses: Laidlaw 0570a & 0570c.
