**Obverse:** Conjoined busts of the Duke & Duchess, left, he bareheaded in uniform, she diademed. Legend: "T.R.H.THE DUKE & DUCHESS OF CORNWALL & YORK".

Reverse: On the left, crowned shield bearing the unofficial coat of arms of Canada used at that time representing seven province Ontario, Quebec, Nova Scotia, New Brunswick, Manitoba, British Columbia and Prince Edward Island. Around, on right wreath with two smaller wreaths within: on top, a rose wreath with ornate: "G (for George)" inside and below to the right wreath with ornate: "M (for Mary)" inside. On a rectangular plaque below: "WELCOME". Signed round the rim at the for ELLIS & CO. TORONTO".

**Notes:** The Duke and Duchess of Cornwall and York (later King George V and Queen Mary) visited Canada during September October 1901, travelling across the continent and back again. This was a component of a wider world tour, including Au New Zealand and South Africa, partly as a show of Royal appreciation for loyalty during the Boer War.
